## NON-RESIDENTIAL STATS

**HOTLINE CALLS:** A hotline call is generally the first step for self-referral to Safe Haven's services.

**2,114**

total hotline calls  
*Averaging 175 hotline calls a month.*

**CLIENT ASSESSMENTS:** All of Safe Haven's clients are self-referrals. The first step to establishing services at Safe Haven is an initial assessment.

total client assessments  
*Total of 368 individuals*

**ONE-ON-ONE CASE MANAGEMENT:** Trauma-informed case management for non-residents includes emotional support, legal advocacy, housing advocacy, parenting support, developing healthy coping mechanisms and strengthening resilience.

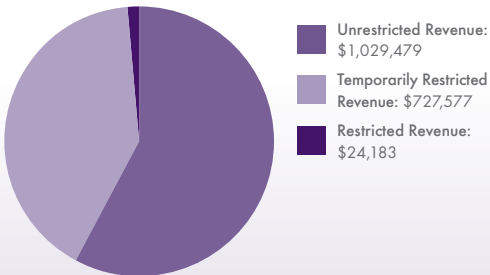

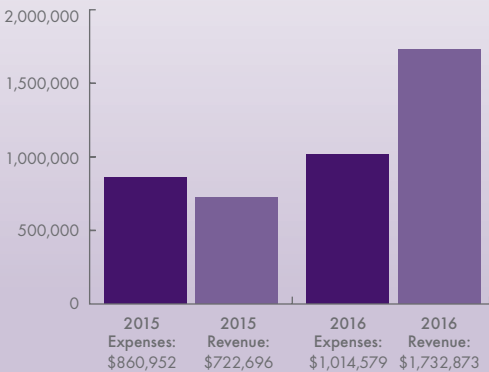
