The kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is beyond our vision.

This is what we are about: We plant seeds that one day will grow.

We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise.

We lay foundations that will need further development.

We provide yeast that produces effects beyond our capabilities.

We cannot do everything and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that.

This enables us to do something, and to do it well.

It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way,

an opportunity for God's grace to enter and to do the rest.

We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker.

We are workers, not master builders; ministers, not messiahs.

We are prophets of a future not our own. Amen.

This prayer was first shared by Michigan Bishop Untener in a gathering that recognized Archbishop Oscar Romero's martyred death as an advocate against injustice in his service and ministry in El Salvador.

The paradox of pain and possibility is held in our minds and actions each day at Safe Haven Ministries. I'm often lamenting February's sunless skies and bitter winds during our long days of crisis intervention and navigating the complexity of systems that fail to respond with accountability. Yet seeds, little dry pods, are planted in the deep rich dark soil - dormant with possibility before they push their way through the dirt to spring up toward the light.

Each day small and extravagant acts of kindness, justice, and service are connected to Safe Haven's mission so that the future is different and one of possibility for people being abused, controlled and manipulated in harmful acts. We will not let the threats that echo in someone's mind, the physical scars and the manipulative pain be the ending to their story.

On MLK day a child in our shelter took a crayon and colored in the the lines on a worksheet inviting her to "dream". She added stars around the outline of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and wrote "I dream to bring affordable housing and stable housing to all people." To dream of a future not our own and to plant seeds that hold promise. In our safe and secure shelter on that day a child's crayons and script spoke possibility.

Our vision is remarkably difficulty because we enter by God's grace into the pain and brokenness of abuse and exploitation in our world with intentionality and purpose. We believe in the long journey toward justice and shalom, where nothing is missing and nothing is broken in our lives or our world. It helps every now and then to take the long view... future promise is here as a child colors in safety and coming still for what is to be.

SHELTER & HOUSING

Through the capital campaign we doubled our capacity to increase shelter services to 14 suites & 56 beds. This leveraged our work to continue to expand our services to add an additional 21 households of re-housing and transitional housing in 2024.



HUMAN TRAFFICKING

In 2022 we expanded our mission to include service provision for people victimized by human trafficking. We have served over 100 victims in our trauma informed facilities to meet the complex needs of exploitation.




COLLABORATION
